

Theatre West has been bustling with activity. People are coming and going all the time and it's great. There's only one problem - people aren't locking up, they're leaving trash and they're forgetting to turn off the AC/heat. We've got to develop new habits where we assume we're all the last to leave. Before you leave the theatre, look around and see if there is any trash that you or anyone else has left. If the trash needs to be emptied, please empty it. Make sure the lights are off and the AC or heater isn't running. Be sure to lock both the front door and the upstairs gate. We've had uninvited visitors hanging out again and it's real important that we keep the theatre locked up. They leave trash and cigarette butts so please don't walk past it on your way in the theatre. It's gross, I know. I hate picking it up myself but we can't ignore it. There is no cleaning crew at Theatre West. We're it. We'll be able to utilize the services of the Assistance League for community service hours because we've been reactivated, but that won't ever be consistent or often.
