Section 3 RESPONSIBILITIES OF MEMBERSHIP A. Attendance at the annual meeting is highly encouraged.

B. It is expected that members will participate in at least one scheduled work-party during a given year.

C. All members are expected to donate 24 hours of time per calendar year to serve on committees, house staff, backstage staff, office staff, and cleaning crew and shall donate a minimum of \$50 towards the donations of supplies to keep concession and cleaning supplies stocked. Volunteer hours and donations dollars shall be reported online once a month. If a member opts not to donate any time, they may make an annual tax deductible cash contribution of \$200.

3 NEW YEAR'S RESOLUTIONS YOU CAN KEEP!

1. TAKE YOUR FOOD AND DRINK AND WET/FOOD GARBAGE WITH YOU WHEN YOU LEAVE. Please do not leave half-empty cups of coffee and water lying around, either backstage or in the house.

2. PROPERLY BAR THE BACK DOOR. If it's not barred properly, someone can pry open the door and get inside. The bar should be UNDER the metal handle and OVER the door jamb on BOTH sides. There is also a notice posted on the door explaining how to do it.

3. PLEASE ALWAYS MAKE SURE THE UPSTAIRS GATE IS LOCKED! It's a little bit tricky so here's how to do it: Don't just shake the upstairs gate to see if it is latched, as the latch my be unlocked. So when checking the upstairs gate, turn the knob to make sure it is locked. Locking instructions: When you close the upstairs gate, turn the knob (the one you open the gate with) all the way to the left. Test by turning the knob to the right, to make sure it isn't opening the latch.
