Synopsis

In The Italian in Me, a doe-eyed aspiring actress - who has been raised on a heaping dose of old fashioned values & Roman Catholic guilt - upends her life by moving from North America to Italy. With her, she brings a suitcase full of unanswered spiritual questions, a tiny bit of cash, and grandiose dreams of working in Italian Cinema. Once in Rome, she learns that things in the Eternal City are not as 'holy' or 'romantic' as she had imagined. When everyday life becomes a sexual obstacle course, she does the only thing she knows how: pray! Her prayers appear to be answered when she meets up with the Maestro, Federico Fellini, Will this encounter turn out to be the 'Dolce Vita' she was searching for?

DINA MORRONE is the winner of the Valley Theatre Award for her solo show *The Italian In Me*, based on a chance meeting with the Maestro, Federico Fellini, in Rome, Italy. Mel Brooks said of Dina's performance/show, "One of the truly funniest nights I've spent in the theater." When Dina is not writing self-deprecating comedic solo shows, plays, and short stories, she's the editor/contributing writer for the socially conscious lifestyle magazine, The Eden Magazine, where she has interviewed the likes of Louis Gossett Jr., Gina Lol-

Synopsis

Los Angeles's longest running solo show returns to the stage. Alarmed when her 10-year-old daughter decides to do her women's history report on Cher or Janet Jackson, Mom becomes obsessed with and gets inspiration and strength from our unknown, unheralded and forgotten women in history. Going back and forth from the past to the present, Amy Simon poignantly finds the funny as she chronicles the struggles and accomplishments of our unheralded, unknown and forgotten heroines whose courage and strength inspire her as she raises her two daughters in these funny, enlightening, politically and socially relevant, emotionally charged slices of modern and herstorical life.

AMY SIMON, Playwright, Producer, Actress, Published Writer, and Cultural HERstorian, has been acting since childhood, and writing and producing theater for most of her adult life. Her first play, Cheerios In My Underwear (And Other True Tales Of Motherhood), held the record as the longest-running solo play in Los Angeles until it was broken by SHE'S HISTORY! which debuted in 2010 at The Skirball Cultural Center in Los Angeles, and has been performed around the country. Amy is a member of SAG-AFTRA, The Dramatists Guild, Los Angeles Female Playwrights Initiative, Association of Los Angeles Playwrights and here at Theatre West where she has been developing SHE IS HISTORY!, a full

cast, all-female version of the solo play. Amy is divorced mother of two daughters - who inspired her playwrighting career - and who can tell you all about the first woman to run for president. www.sheshistory.com

Synopsis

From A Yardie To A Yankee is Sardia's own, personal story of her journey from Jamaica to America. Born into a poverty-stricken Jamaican neighborhood, Sardia had to overcome numerous hurdles in everyday life. Even as a young girl, Sardia dreamed of becoming a Hollywood actress. Then, an unplanned pregnancy added yet more hurdles. Sardia's engaging and unique storytelling style takes audience members on an emotional rollercoaster ride fraught with peril, pain, suffering, but also filled with humor, endearing characters, and the undeterred human spirit to survive.

SARDIA ROBINSON is a writer, actress and producer. She is a leader in shifting the narrative for Jamaicans in Hollywood and working steadily to bring diverse, complex, genuine characters to television and film. Sardia immigrated to Chicago and proudly graduated from Columbia College, Chicago, with a BA in Theatre.

Audiences have raved about From a Yardie to a Yankee at New York's United Solo Theatre Festival, The Atlanta Black Theatre Festival, Shakespeare in Paradise (The Bahamas), and the Hollywood Fringe Festival, where Sardia was honored with the festival's prestigious "Innovative Women in Theatre" award. The screenplay for the film version of From a Yardie to a Yankee, also written by Sardia, is currently in pre-production. From LA to New York to London and beyond, Sardia is changing the way the world views the Jamaican experience on stage and screen.

2022 is shaping up to be Sardia's busiest year yet. In February, Sardia performed her show for Black History Month at The University of the Pacific. She just wrapped shooting Just Justice, starring as Amy Jaques Garvey, wife of controversial Black activist Marcus Garvey. You can also catch Sardia starring in House Out of Order, a 2022 hit TV sitcom currently airing and making a splash in the Caribbean. Page 9

THE LIFE AND TIMES OF A. EINSTEIN

THE LIFE AND TIMES OF A. EINSTEIN Written and performed by

Kres Mersky

A comedy about a day in the life of Einstein as seen through the eyes of his secretary.

<u>Synopsis</u>

The Life and Times of A. Einstein, written and with Kres Mersky, features one character on stage, and that character is not Albert Einstein himself. It is rather the person of Ellen Shoenhammer, his secretary, but she is much more than that; as her duties include being his chauffeur and his bodyguard (she is handy with a gun). In present-day terms, she might be called a personal assistant, whose duties include being a liaison to the media, protecting his public image from scandal, and generally managing all of his business affairs. As is the case so often, it is a matter of a hard-working woman being markedly responsible for a successful man.

It's Einstein's birthday, there's a press conference for him, and he's been unavoidably detained. So, Ellen is essentially "vamping" for him until he can get there. She addresses the assembled reporters out there (who would physically be where the audience is), talks to them about her beloved boss, and fields questions, evading answers when necessary.

She relates her long association with the Einstein family, how she met the great man and came to work for him, the departure from an ever-more-dangerous Berlin to work at Princeton University, the extraordinary research that changed the way humanity perceives the entire universe. Naturally, someone asks her to explain the Theory of Relativity. She denies that she can, and then proceeds to do exactly that, albeit in hilariously oversimplified laymen's terms.


Through the course of the action, the audience is given a substantive insight into one of the most extraordinary lives of the century just past, that of Albert Einstein, the man whose name is synonymous with genius. In the course of a play that is by turns informative, very funny, and occasionally poignant, Albert and Ellen become real people for the audience.



Her second full length play, Algerian Romance was work-shopped at the Mark Taper Forum and produced at Primary Stages in New York and also at Theatre West. Kres is a member of Theatre West, the Dramatist's Guild and The Alliance of Los Angeles Playwrights.

PAUL GERSTEN (Director) was a successful advertising photographer and commercial director in Los Angeles for 30 years and a 6th grade Math/ Science teacher for 20 yrs. In addition, he has directed Kres in her one woman shows and numerous short plays. Also at Theatre West, Paul directed *Flag Day*, an 11 character comedy about a very off-beat family. He is now touring with Kres with *The Life And Times Of A. Einstein* this year to Washington state, New Mexico and New York. Presently, Paul has retired from teaching and devoting all his efforts to the show.

Synopsis

It's 2:30 in the morning in the summer of 1994, and Jimmy Stewart can't sleep. As he putters around the den in his house at 918 Roxbury Drive, he begins to reminisce about his wonderful life on and off the screen. Hear one of Hollywood's favorite storytellers share tales of early Hollywood—his film triumphs, his biggest bombs, his youthful misadventures with lifelong pal Henry Fonda, and his amorous exploits with some of movieland's top leading ladies. Find out what it was like behind the scenes with John Wayne, Grace Kelly, Greta Garbo, Alfred Hitchcock, John Ford, and more. And learn about the man behind the movie legend—his boyhood, his family, the personal tragedy, and the real-life heroism that made him not just America's favorite movie star, but one of America's favorite people. Steve Nevil's acclaimed solo show has toured the country (including NY and the Jimmy Stewart Museum in Indiana, PA) and returns to Theatre West (where it was first conceived almost twenty years ago) for two performances only, prior to its engagement at Edinburgh's theatre festival next year.

STEVE NEVIL returns with his piece that first premiered here in 2004 and has toured the country for almost two decades. Steve has played other famous people on stage, most recently Richard Nixon in Mark Wilding's acclaimed Our Man in Santiago, also at Theatre West. He'll reprise that role in New York this fall at the AMT theatre off-Broadway. His other stage roles include The Genius with Mare Winningham, A History of the American Film with Ruben Santiago-Hudson, and the 40th anniversary production of Spoon River Anthology directed by Betty Garrett. Steve's 45 years of film and TV credits can be found on the Imdb website. As a playwright, Steve received the Hollywood Fringe Critics Choice Award for his play Welcome to Heretofor in 2017. His play, The Night Forlorn premiered in 2018 at TW and won the Valley Theatre Award for Best Play of the season.

TED SNYDER (Director and Co-Author) spent much of his life performing on stage as an actor, singer and musician. His credits have included leading roles in The Boys in the Band and Your Own Thing and also touring extensively for the USO. With Jimmy Stewart. Ted added director to his resume as well. Ted lived in Whittier with his wife Terry and their two cats for many years, all the while pursuing "an incoherent array of avocations": political consultant, homeowner's association president, mountain peak-bagger, and photographer. He was the writer-editor for the Santa Ana district of the US Postal Service, where he provided and wrote a management newsletter & website. Ted was also instrumental in navigating Steve's presence as featured performer at the Jimmy Stewart Stamp

Ceremony at Universal Studios back in 2007. Ted passed away from stage four brain cancer in February of 2017. He shared a birthday with Jimmy Stewart (May 20th) and was Steve's close friend for over 40 years.

Steve dedicates this 2022 production to his director and great friend Ted Snyder, to Yancey Dunham--whose artistic presence is sorely missed, and to his first drama professor Jean Korf, a great mentor and friend.


With her nod to the radical origins of the art-form Tessa Bell is a very modern artist who confronts and comments on the world as it is today with humor and compassion, making sense of the chaos that surrounds us by the strength and beauty of her vivid rendition of classic songs.




